73 HOURS PER WEEK

A person working for minimum wage (\$7.25/hour) needs to work 73 hours a week to afford a modest 1 bedroom apartment in Johnson County at Fair Market Rent. At minimum wage, affordable rent is \$377/month - Fair Market Rent in Iowa City is \$684/month.

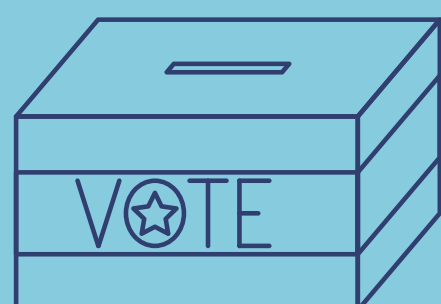
